The programme, co-designed by young people, is delivered from our warehouse in Bedminster, South Bristol. It's a busy, fully-functioning operation which is friendly, warm and welcoming and the perfect environment for FareChance participants to develop, learn and grow.

Who is Fare(hance for?

Through FareChance we strive to meet the needs of young people who have limited access to mainstream support. Many of the young people we work with are unemployed, at risk of exclusion from school, looking to gain work experience, have physical and mental health needs, have learning difficulties, and lack in self-esteem and confidence.

Within weeks of joining the programme, we've seen young people fully engage, gain skills, and develop friendships. .

How does the programme work?

FareChance is a 10-week programme, split up over three days, and is available for up to eight participants per cohort.

The eight participants are divided into two groups of four and asked to take part on one of our Monday or Tuesday courses focused on employment, personal development and training.

The group then come together on the Thursday to take part in our FareChance Warehouse Takeover to gain practical warehouse management experience!

Mondays and Tuesdays

This course is focused on personal and professional development. It aims to teach young people how to realise their self-worth, and engage with the job market to find meaningful employment.

We nurture our participants' interests and skills to support them to achieve their personal goals, and offer practical and online training to improve their performance and knowledge of working in a warehouse setting.

The programme includes:

- Career away days with Bristol's dynamic and diverse industry professionals
- Confidence-building workshops
- Employment-focused workshops
- Online training courses
- Warehouse logistics training

Thursdays

This is where the real fun begins! Every Thursday, both groups will come together to take part in our Vale Lane Warehouse Take Over!

All participants will have the opportunity to gain valuable management experience through working together to run the distribution warehouse operation with support from our dedicated, trained and friendly FareShare warehouse staff!

- Storespersons
- Goods in and inputting
- Administration
- Driver's mate

- Warehouse maintenance
- Pump trucking
- Label printing
- Van crew
